

FIELD TRIP SCHEDULE APRIL–SEPTEMBER 2025

April 6, Sunday, 9:00 am, Long Island Sound with Jodi Brodsky (845-282-1058). Meet Jodi in the Rye Playland parking lot at 9:00 am for loons, grebes, Long-tailed Ducks, and Purple Sandpipers. Please let Jodi know *in advance* whether you will be attending.

April 12, Saturday, 8:30 am, Wallkill River National Wildlife Refuge with Rich Van Tieghem (201-370-2721). Meet Rich at the Oil City Road platform at 8:30 am for Blue and Green-winged Teal, egrets, gallinules, and Sandhill Cranes.

April 27, Sunday, 8:30 am, 6 1/2 Station Road with Liz McKnight (201-400-1428). Meet Liz at the junction of 6 1/2 Station Road and the Heritage Trail in Goshen, New York, for ducks, swallows, kinglets, and Yellow-rumped Warblers.

April 30, Wednesday, 8:30 am, Stewart State Forest with Bill Fiero (845-728-5208). Meet Bill at the North Barron Road parking area in Montgomery, New York, as gnatcatchers, kinglets, early warblers, and so on start to show up.

May 3, Saturday, 8:00 am, Bashakill Wildlife Management Area, Wurtsboro, New York, with Joyce Depew (845-978-9952). Meet Joyce at the first (DEC) parking lot, before you get to the Haven Road bridge as you're coming from Route 209, and we'll see if we can identify 70 species for the day.

May 7, Wednesday, 8:00 am, Stewart State Forest with Bill Fiero (845-728-5208). Meet Bill at the North Ridge Road parking lot in Montgomery, New York. Anything is possible as spring migration heats up. White-eyed Vireo or Yellow-breasted Chat maybe?

May 10, Saturday, 8:00 am, Hudson Highlands Nature Center Outdoor Discovery Campus (formerly Kenridge Farm), Cornwall, New York, with Amy Greher (845-774-9399). Meet Amy at the Cornwall dog park on Muser Drive, and we'll see if we can find a Mourning or Cape May Warbler!

May 14, Wednesday, 8:00 am, Goosepond Mountain State Park, Chester, New York, with Bob Slechta (845-541-8210). Meet bob in the parking lot next to the Chester McDonald's, and we'll see what we can turn up.

May 16 and 17, Friday and Saturday, annual Break 100. See how many birds your team can identify in Orange County! Each team must consist of at least 2 people. Pick any contiguous 24-hour period from Friday to Saturday that your team prefers. Contact Karen Miller (845-381-3203) for details, and keep an eye on Groups.io for updates.

August 23, Saturday, 8:00 am, Black Dirt plus with Dave Baker (845-440-4030). This trip will start at the Oil City Road platform in the Wallkill River National Wildlife Refuge and will then move on to the Black Dirt region to look for shorebirds.

September 6, Saturday, 8:00 am, Hudson Highlands Nature Center Outdoor Discovery Campus (formerly Kenridge Farm), Cornwall, New York, with Amy Greher (845-774-9399). Meet Amy at the Cornwall dog park on Muser Drive at 8:00 am for a rewarding day of birding as fall migration starts up.

September 13, Saturday, 8:00 am, Bashakill Wildlife Management Area, Wurtsboro, New York, with Joyce Depew (845-978-9952). Meet Joyce at the first (DEC) parking lot, before you get to the Haven Road Bridge as you come in from Route 209. Philadelphia Vireo and Gray-cheeked Thrush are possibilities.

September 24, Wednesday, 8:30 am, Winding Waters Trail, Wallkill River National Wildlife Refuge, with Rich Van Tieghem (201-370-2721). This is a tentative trip because the refuge has been playing around with access to this location in the fall. Watch Groups.io for any scheduling changes for this trip to a Connecticut Warbler hotspot.

September 28, Sunday, 9:00 am, 6 1/2 Station Road with Liz McKnight (201-400-1428). Meet Liz at the intersection of the Heritage Trail and 6 1/2 Station Road in Goshen, New York, for fall migration birding.
